### **URIRI CIDC SUCCESS STORIES**

he Femicorner Industry Association is a social enterprise that deals in the mass production and sewing reusable sanitary towels for women of reproductive age. They also produce breast pads for cancer patients, especially those who have undergone a mastectomy, reusable postpartum maternity pads for women who have just delivered and colostomy bags for gastrointestinal surgical patients. So far, the Association has employed over 42 youth and reached over 3,000 school going ladies in different schools to create awareness on menstruation and breast cancer.

The Association, housed in MSEA's Uriri Constituency Industrial Development Center (CIDC) in Migori County and registered under the registrar of MSEs, launched their reusable sanitary pads last month. The Sanitary pads have a lifespan of 2 to 3 years. The founder and CEO, Michael Oginga is a MbelenaBiz awardee.

Uriri CIDC is currently being upgraded by the Authority to be a Center of Excellence in the Western region.

### INTERNATIONAL YOUTH WEEK 2021- DREAMS YOUTH EXPO 2021

outh engagement has been identified as a critical element to achieving sustainable social-economic development under the UN Youth Agenda 2030. Young people are the drivers of social change; supporting their enterprises and cultivating their entrepreneurial mindsets will empower society economically, socially and politically.

To mark the International Youth Week 2021, Laikipia County held the Dreams Youth Expo on 12th and 13th August 2021. The Expo was a project by the Drawing Dreams Initiative (DDI) geared towards Inspiring, empowering and impacting the youth in business around communities by raising awareness on their role in economic development and exposing them to new ideas and emerging trends and technologies.

Youth in the creative & digital economy were provided with free exhibition space, connected with key stakeholders (National/county governments, corporates, financial institutions, learning institutions and non-governmental organizations).

#### KYEOP ENROLLMENT

pplications for cycle 7A grant applications were open from 7th July 2021 and closed on 20th August 2021. The Cycle 7B grant for business/ entrepreneurship training applications run until the 21st September 2021. To reach out to more youths in counties that had previously registered low turnout, the Authority tailor -made messages in the local dialects spoken by the majority in each of the 17 counties. A total of 203, 319 applications were received at the close of the campaign. Out of those, only 91,043 applications were validated.

These valid applications will be randomized and successful applicants will receive digital Business Development Services (BDS) and undertake the Entrepreneurship Aptitude Test. Only those who complete the aptitude test will be invited for grants orientation. MSEA will support over 30,000 self-employed youth by providing business startup grants to boost their Micro and Small Enterprises (MSE) in cycle 7.

### PROFILING OF MSES IN NAIROBI AND KIAMBU CIDCS AND WORKSITES

he Authority has been carrying out a campaign to profile unique products that CIDCs across the counties offer through MSEs and their enterprises. The profiling of MSEs also entails building their capacity to market their products on social media platforms. One of the worksites visited in Nairobi is the Embakasi Village Crafts Market.

The facility is occupied by the Embakasi Curio Village Association with over 600 members. The association members deal in soapstone carving, beading, making of drums and weaving.

Among the MSEs profiled at the site was Mr. Patrick Kimondio of Village Crafts and Jewellers. He has employed two young men who assist him in carving wood to make spoons, trays, household decorations and toys. Some of the products are made using a manual machine, while others are handmade. Mr. Kimondio has a shop in Galleria on Langata road where he sells the products.

Still at the site is the Art Safi Self Help Group led by Mr Charles Ombasa. The group makes unique carvings using soapstone for commercial and household purposes. The products include chess boards, animal carvings and house decorations. They sell their products locally and internationally at Maasai market, village Market, and the United Kingdom.

Another MSE also profiled at the site was Emma Mukhisia, the proprietor of Beauty Free Shop. Emma has a business that sells hand-crafted beaded ornaments, including small baskets, necklaces, earrings and bangles.



She also does the weaving of bags and hats. Emma markets her products locally in malls such as Sarit Centre and internationally to shops in South Africa.

### KIAMBU COUNTY; GATUANYAGA JUAKALI WORKSITE

The facility hosts Mugumoini Juakali worksite and is occupied by 100 MSEs who are mostly youth dealing in automotive works of panel beating, wiring and repainting, welding, electrical works and upholstery.


